LESSON PLAN: Superheroes

Three Key Learning Goals:

- 1. Develop and practice French vocabulary related to superheroes in order to write a short journal.
- 2. Read provided examples as a model for inventing new heroes and journal entries.
- 3. Practise media creation skills by drawing an illustration of a superhero and describing this hero.

Subject: Superheroes

Introduction & Minds-on learning

PART 1:

A) Vocabulary

• 2 minutes: Quickly Read the vocabulary list at the beginning of the lesson. This list of terms is intended to be used as a reference by students to help them acquire and apply relevant French vocabulary.

B) Communication

 Read the paragraph in section B on modern superheroes and then answer the communication question: If you could have any superpower, which would you choose? In a group setting, have a

	discussion where students share and compare ideas. (If a student is working individually, he/she can alternatively record ideas in point-form on paper.)	
Create your own superhero WORKSHEET	 PART 2: generating ideas and brainstorming Duration: 20 minutes Show students the illustrated examples of the superhero parodies on the diaslearning.com websit These can serve as inspiration for students when the will create, illustrate, and describe their own superheroes. Students can complete the first part of the downloadable PDF worksheet focused on drawing rough sketch of their superhero. PART 3: Reading and Writing 	
	 Students should read the three descriptions of invented/parodied superheroes in part 3. These can serve as examples/models for students as they complete the questions on the bottom of the "Create your superhero" PDF worksheet. 	
Consolidation & Debrief	PART 4: Journal Writing Students should use the answers on their PDF worksheet as the rough draft to write a short journal about their superhero (about 7-8 sentences in length). They are free to add any other information and details about their hero (for instance: age, hobbies, interests, siblings, etc) The vocabulary list on diaslearning.com is a REFERENCE which they are encouraged to use to help them complete this journal.	
	PART 5: Ask students to create their own Comic story about their superhero using the downloadable comic PDF template. It is recommended that students create a comic that is 1 to 3 pages in length.
